Smart Bond Initiative

Passed by New York Voters in November of 2014 Awarded \$2 Billion to all public schools based on enrollment and state aid formula.

Pulaski was allocated \$1,209,470



Considerations

- Can not pay salaries
- Cannot be used for leasing, rentals, or BOCES purchases



Step 1

Administration consults with the district's architect to establish possible priorities in the approved categories.

Consideration to:

- Strategic Plan
- Technology Plan
- Building Condition Survey

Upgrade to Classroom Devices and Wireless Access Points

Pulaski completed phase 2

\$111,584

Upgrade to Existing Security System



Proposed Phase 3

The District proposes the installation of additional security upgrades:

- High resolution exterior cameras for Elementary and MS/HS School
- Upgrades to remaining light posts at both schools
- Upgrades to NVR Servers at both schools
- Removal of all old exterior cameras and coaxial cable at both schools

Estimated Cost - \$713,032



Step 2 Smart School Planning Committee

Establish a Smart Bond Planning Committee to review the administration proposals.

Membership must include: Students

Staff
Administrators
Board of Education
Community

Committee Responsibilities

Committee reviews the preliminary proposals from the district and formulates a recommendation to the Board of Education.

If the committee can endorse this plan the district administration will present it to the Board of Education at the next Board meeting.



Next Steps

- 1. The Board of Education may accept this proposals as a preliminary recommendation and posts it for 30 days for public review.
- 2. After 30 days a Public Hearing will be held to review any public comments the proposal.
- At a regular meeting, the Board of Education either accepts the proposal, or returns it to committee.
- 4. IF approved by the Board of Education, the Superintendent submits the spending plan to NYSED for review.
- 5. After six to eight months the district's plan is approved for expenditure.
